FEES AND SCHEDULES

Women's Choice maintains moderate fees and a sliding fee scale to assist people in meeting their reproductive health needs. We accept some types of Medi-Cal and private insurance with prior authorization.

You can make appointments and seek consultation over the phone during our regular office hours, Monday-Friday 9:00- 5:00pm.

- Confidential STI diagnosis and treatment, including HIV testing and counseling, for women and their partners.
- Annual pap smears, pelvic exams and breast exams
- Complete physical exams
- Birth control services (the pill, diaphragm, IUDs, condoms)
- Diagnosis, treatment, and counseling for urinary tract infections, vaginal infections, sexually transmitted diseases/infections, and irregular menstruation.
- Tuberculosis testing
- Premenstrual syndrome help
- Follow-up treatment for abnormal pap smears at Women's Choice includes colposcopy, biopsy, cryotherapy and chemical treatment of genital warts. Counseling and discussions will help you understand your pap smear results and treatment.
- Drop-in services for pregnancy tests, ultrasound for gestational age
- Surgical and medical abortion services
- Counseling and support services



The Berkeley Mobile Crisis team works to reduce the impact of mental health emergencies through immediate response to crisis situations at the street-level and through coordination and consultation with local public safety organizations, hospitals and other community groups.

- Deliver crisis intervention services at locations throughout the community (suicide, homicide, threats, drug abuse, evaluation for psychiatric hospitalization)
- Provide consultation to hospital emergency personnel, community agencies and citizens
- Disaster and trauma-related mental health services
- Provide consultation to police and fire departments regarding known or potential mental health cases

This free, confidential service for individuals is provided by lay volunteers trained in active listening skills: this is the basic, "talk therapy" approach

Counseling is available on drop in basis, through individual schedules, appointments, and on an ongoing, long term basis.

Comprehensive Community

Treatment (CCT): These case management and support services have been designed for people with serious and persistent mental disabilities. Comprehensive Community Treatment patients are people with histories of psychiatric hospitalization who are in need of mental health, and other medical and social services, and who require long-term comprehensive services to maintain stability in the community.

Assertive Community Treatment Team

(ACT): The ACT team provides very comprehensive case management and support services for people whose problems have resulted in multiple and lengthy hospitalizations or whose health and mental health status puts them at critically high risk. Patients are seen on a daily basis, when necessary, to obtain assistance with multiple and complex needs.

Homeless Outreach helps people living on the streets and in shelters who need assistance to connect with health, mental health, substance abuse and related social services.

Harm Reduction Supplies

At NEED's three sites you'll find an ample supply of the following: syringes (27g 5/8" 1cc; 28g 1/2" 1cc and 1/2 cc; 29g 1/2" 1cc and 1/2cc; as well as assorted muscling needles), cotton, cookers, ties, biohazard containers, alcohol pads,. We also have have spark plug covers, brillo pads, and ascorbic acid (vitamin C, "breakdown") for safer crack use, and assorted condoms and lube. If there's a supply you don't see, just ask; we might have it!

Wound Care

Trained community health workers provide wound and abscess care at site on Thursdays.

Overdose Prevention

Preventing an overdose is essential knowledge for anyone using injection drugs. We aim to educate users and staff alike on the basics of overdose prevention, including the use of naloxone to reverse the effect of an opiate.

Information & Referrals

At each site we have available information on a variety of providers offering services pertinent to exchange users and community members, including HIV/AIDS testing and prevention; STD testing and education; and addiction programs.
